



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### **Malaria**

### **Progress**

Mali has carried out insecticide resistance monitoring since 2014 and has reported the results to WHO. The malaria commodities required to achieve and sustain universal coverage in 2016 are financed and Mali has procured sufficient LLINs to achieve 100% operational coverage. The country has carried out insecticide resistance monitoring since 2014 and has reported the results to WHO. Mali was awarded the 2016 ALMA Award for Excellence for Most Improved in Malaria Control between 2011 and 2015.

#### **Impact**

The annual reported number of malaria cases in 2014 was 2,590,643 with 2,309 deaths. WHO, through modeling, estimates that there has been a less than 50% decrease in malaria incidence between 2000 and 2015.

MNCH <sup>1</sup> : Optimise quality of care	Work to accelerate coverage of ARTs in the total population and in children under 14 years of age	Q1 2017		Deliverable not yet due but Mali has increased ART coverage by 2% in the total population and by 3% in children. The country has supported the policy shift to Test-and-Treat all children and Option B+ for PMTCT and is working to enhance community engagement. Mali aims to improve the quality of medical care through capacity building for prescribers, patient education, and shifting ARV prescription tasks to paramedics; and implementing community-based case management (including psychosocial support, active searching for patients lost to follow-up, home visits, community days)

Mali has responded positively to the MNCH recommended action addressing low coverage of exclusive breastfeeding and lack of data on vitamin A and continues to track progress as this action is implemented.
