



Malaria

Progress

Togo has secured sufficient resources to achieve universal coverage of LLINs, RDTs and ACTs in 2016. The country has distributed sufficient LLINs to achieve 100% operational coverage.

Impact

The annual reported number of malaria cases in 2014 was 1,130,251 and 1,205 deaths. WHO, through modeling, estimates that there has been a less than 50% decrease in malaria incidence between 2000 and 2015.

The country is improving service provision by promoting an integrated approach utilising existing MNCH services including in the private sector. Taskshifting and mentoring and training of treatment providers and enhanced community mobilisation efforts are also ongoing
